The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (Byrne/JAG) Program is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. Byrne/JAG local allocation funds may be used to support a range of program areas including law enforcement, prosecution and court programs, prevention and education programs and crime victim and witness programs. The Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) has historically managed Byrne/JAG local grant allocations for all cities in Broward County.

The City of Fort Lauderdale Police Department will be receiving \$111,972 in funding under the FY 2016 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program. These funds can be used for a number of law enforcement purposes. The Fort Lauderdale Police Department proposes to use our FY 2016 Byrne/JAG allocation to purchase equipment and supplies in support of patrol operations, criminal and special investigations.
